From The Assistant Principal

There have been instances of parents texting children while their children are in class, and cases of children texting parents, in some cases causing distractions or disruptions that affect teaching and learning. If you need to get important information to your child, please call the main office. If your child needs to contact home, they should do so through the main office. The use of electronic devices, unless allowed by teacher/administrator for educational purposes, is not permitted during the course of the school day.

We have had a few questions regarding food and drinks outside of the cafeteria, and some instances of sharing food and beverages in and out of the cafeteria. As a reminder, there should be no chewing of gum, or eating food or candy in the school at any time with the exception of food in the cafeteria or with special permission from the principal. Students should not be sharing food. It can be unsanitary, unsafe, pose issues for those with allergies, and at times has been disruptive. Students are allowed to have water. Teachers may ask students to throw other items in the trash if they show up in their rooms.

As the weather gets warmer, many students will take advantage of the nice days, choosing to walk or ride bikes home rather than take the bus. Please remind your children to be safe as they head home and to be respectful of the businesses and residences they pass along the way. Students should try and stay on sidewalks and be careful when crossing any streets. They should also be aware that they should not use the playground behind Indian Head School until the elementary school is dismissed.



SCHOOL NURSE NEWS



ILLNESSES:

• MA DPH has updated the guidance for covid 19 isolation to align with the new CDC guidance. The 5 day isolation for positive covid 19 infection is no longer required for the general population. Guidance for symptoms of a respiratory virus (including flu and covid 19) is updated on the MA DPH website at Staying home to prevent the spread of respiratory viruses - Mass.gov

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- Please continue to be cautious and keep sick children home. If your child is experiencing more than one symptom such as cough, sore throat, congestion, headache, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, and/or fatigue, they should stay home and be seen by their pediatrician as needed.
- As always, if your child has a **fever of 100 or higher**, they need to stay home until they are fever free for 24 hours without taking any fever-reducing medicine.

ABSENCES:

- Please remember to call the absence sick line (781-618-7375) or the nurse directly to report your student absent and be sure to include the reason for absence. I will be following up with phone calls home as needed regarding illnesses and absences.
- If your child does see their doctor for an illness, please ask for a doctor's note for their absence(s) from school so your child's absence can be marked as excused.
- If your child is absent due to an illness/medical condition for 5 or more consecutive days, a doctor's note verifying clearance for return to school is required.

INJURIES/RESTRICTIONS:

• If your child has sustained an injury, we must have a note from the doctor stating the child's physical limitations/restrictions, including a gym excuse note and order for the use of assistive devices such as crutches or a wheelchair

MANDATED SCREENINGS:

- Scoliosis screenings will begin April 10th. The PE teachers assist me with conducting this screening process. Notification letters regarding this were emailed to parent/guardian(s). If you do not want your child to participate in this screening please contact me in writing prior to April 10. If we notice positive findings with your child, you will receive a letter from me asking that you follow up with your child's pediatrician. Letters will go out once all screenings are completed.
- All Grade 7 screenings are completed and referral letters were mailed home for those students who did not pass on either the vision or hearing screenings.


