


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From Guidance - Ms. Levy, Ms. Sweeney and Ms. Fischbach

From the Assistant Principal

Afterschool activities are off to a great start! We were able to run all but one of our offerings. Please remember that students should be picked up by 3:50. We will offer another round of activities in January.

Attendance:

As a reminder, please be sure to review our attendance and tardy policies. Students should be prepared for the start of the school day by 7:35 and should be in homeroom by 7:40 to avoid being marked tardy. If a bus is running late, homeroom teachers will be notified and students will not be marked tardy. Attendance at school is expected of all children on a regular basis. If your child will be absent, please call the school office prior to 10:00 A.M. at (781) 618-7375. Pursuant to Chapter 222 Acts of 2012: The school will notify parents or guardians in the event that a student has missed 5 or more school days, unexcused, in a school year requesting a meeting to develop action steps for student attendance. Absences may be excused for the following reasons: illness or quarantine, bereavement or serious illness in family, weather so inclement as to endanger the health of the child, or the observance of major religious holidays.

Electronic Devices:

As Chromebooks have been provided to all students, students do not need access to personal electronic devices. As the policy is written, the use of electronic devices, unless allowed by teacher/administrator for educational purposes, is not permitted during the course of the school day; this includes lunch time. Students should keep phones turned off and away. Headphones should not be used unless for an educational purpose. If you need to reach your child, **we ask that you refrain from texting or calling them**. Instead, please contact the main office.

Afternoon Pick-Up:

When picking children up afterschool, we ask that you do not arrive too early, as traffic is preventing buses from getting to the school before dismissal time. In front of the school, please be sure not to block the bus lane. Doing so often causes the buses to have to cross the double yellow line into oncoming traffic waiting to enter the pick-up loop. Once in the pick-up loop, be sure to leave plenty of room for school vans to park in the pick-up area. Please do not park in front of the vans. Once vans leave, pull up as far as possible.

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Notes from the School Resource Officer

Hello Hanson Middle School Parents,

The School and I have a couple concerns regarding pick-up and drop-off at the school. First is the process as a whole. In the mornings, we must remain single file to ensure the safest drop off routine. Please refrain from going around another vehicle and have the patience for the single file line to move in due time. In the afternoon for pick up, please remind your student to keep an eye out for whoever is picking them up. At times you may have to wait for your student to get outside, in that case please pull up as far as you can to allow others to pick up their students.

Our second, but most important concern, is regarding the school vans. We have a handful of students who get picked up and dropped off in a white school van. These vans are designated as school buses, equipped with school bus signs, and flashing lights. According to the law, when they are boarding students on and off, you CANNOT go around them. This excerpt is from **M.G.L Ch 90 Section 14**;

"When approaching a vehicle which displays a sign bearing the words "SCHOOL BUS" and which is equipped with front and rear alternating flashing red signal lamps which are flashing, as provided in section seven B, and which has been stopped to allow pupils to alight from or board the same, a person operating a motor vehicle or trackless trolley shall, except when approaching from the opposite direction on a divided highway, bring his vehicle or trackless trolley to a full stop before reaching said school bus and shall not thereafter proceed until the warning signals are deactivated, unless directed to the contrary by a police officer duly authorized to control the movement of traffic. Any person who violates the preceding sentence shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$250; and for a second offense by a fine of not less than \$1,000 nor more than \$1,000."

We bring you these concerns and reminders to simply ensure the safety of our students during these heavy traffic times. We all want to drop off or pick up as quickly as possible, but we need to make sure everyone is safe during this process.

SCHOOL NURSE NEWS

ABSENCES:

- Please remember to call the absence sick line (781-618-7375) or the nurse/main office directly to report your student absent and be sure to include the reason for absence. I will be following up with phone calls home as needed regarding illnesses and absences.
- Please call the nurse directly for any COVID -19 illness/absence. It is still highly recommended that you do an at home Covid test if your child has symptoms to help you determine whether to send your child to school. As with any cold/flu symptoms it is always best to keep your child home until symptoms are improved (and fever free) so that your child is comfortable and able to participate fully at school.

REMINDERS

- PARENTS OF GRADE 7 STUDENTS: If you have not done so already, please send in your child's current physical form and immunization record so I can confirm immunization compliance per state law for all grade 7 students.
- MEDICATION AT SCHOOL The Medication Authorization Form needs to be completed by the parent and prescribing doctor in order for me to accept any medicine at school including epi pens and inhalers. Please be sure to bring this completed form when dropping off medication to me. Some doctors may use their own order forms, but the student information and parent section of the Medication Authorization Form still needs to be completed and brought in with the medicine as well. This form can be downloaded from the school website on the "health services" page.
- **EPI PENS AND INHALERS** If your child has a prescribed epi pen or inhaler and you have not yet brought it in for this school year, please remember to do so as soon as possible.
- <u>INJURIES/RESTRICTIONS:</u> If your child has sustained an injury, we must have a note from the doctor stating the child's physical limitations/restrictions, including a gym excuse note and order for the use of assistive devices such as crutches or a wheelchair.

School Council

Are you interested in getting involved with your child's education in another way? If you are, then think about whether you would be interested in joining the Hanson Middle School Council (also called the School Improvement Council). By law, every school is required to have a School Council. The group is made up of parents, teachers, and at least one community member.

The law outlines four major areas of responsibility for councils. School councils are to assist principals in:

- 1. Adopting educational goals for the school that are consistent with local educational policies and statewide student performance standards;
- 2. Identifying the educational needs of students attending the school;
- 3. Reviewing the annual school building budget; and
- 4. Formulating a school improvement plan.

We will meet 4 times during the school year. The meeting schedule is as follows: Wednesday October 11, Wednesday December 13 Wednesday February 14 and Wednesday May 15 each meeting is about an hour, starting at 3:00 PM, and ending around 4:00 PM. Emails will be sent prior to each meeting to inform you whether it will take place or is being cancelled and the reason for cancellation.

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
